Training and Assessment Information

This course is delivered face-to-face in a classroom-based setting, as well as in an automotive workshop and through a work placement.

The timetable for this course will be advised in your Offer Letter and Student Agreement.

You are required to attend classes for 20 hours per week for 24 study weeks and 2 weeks term break. Holiday breaks are as indicated in your timetable.

You will participate in both classroom and practical training in the automotive workshop.

In addition, you will also need to complete approximately 2 hours of additional, unsupervised study per week including general reading and research for assessments.

The work placement component is a total of 180 hours which will be completed in Term 2. The work placement will be completed in an approved automotive workshop and we will assist you to find a work placement or you can find your own. Your work placement will be discussed in detail with you once you start your course.

You will also need to complete assessments for this course which may include:

- Written questions
- Observations

At the beginning of each unit, your trainer and assessor will outline the assessment tasks that must be completed.

Your classes will be conducted in modern classrooms and you will be able to access Wi-Fi. There are also areas for you to relax, as well as conduct additional study.

You will be provided with learning materials relevant to each unit in your course. Textbooks are also available onsite for you to use and borrow if you wish.

Course Credit

You can apply for recognition of existing qualifications or skills, knowledge and experience (credit transfer or recognition of prior learning) as per the information included in our International Student Handbook, which is available at www.willowsinstitute.edu.au

What are the Entry Requirements?

The Training Package requires that those undertaking this qualification must have completed an automotive mechanical Certificate III qualification or be able to demonstrate equivalent competency.

Willows Institute has the following entry requirements:

You must:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Participate in a course entry interview to determine suitability for the course and student needs.
- Have an IELTS* score of 5.5 (test results must be no more than 2 years old). English language competence can also be demonstrated through documented evidence of any of the following:
 - educated for 5 years in an English speaking country; or
 - completed at least 6 months of a Certificate IV level course in an Australian RTO; or
 - successful completion of an English Placement Test.

Note that other English language tests such as PTE and TOEFL can be accepted. You are required to provide your results so that we can confirm they are equivalent to IELTS 5.5.

Course Progress and Attendance

Satisfactory course progress and attendance is very important in order to meet visa requirements. Please read the International Student Handbook carefully for more information.
